North side of the Cloisters at  
Westminster Abbey - as follows

Near this place lies interred  
the Body of John Coleman Esq  
Born in the Parish of  
Killownee in the County  
of Galway and Kinsman  
of Ireland

He served the Royal Familie  
viz King Charles the  
Second & King James  
Second of blessed Memory  
with approved Fidelity  
About fifty Years

And departed this life a true  
Christian and loyal Subject -  
the Second of June 1709  
in the 84 Year of his age

The property was inherited by the  
eldest son of his second wife
